



Scheme of Examination and Evaluation

Class Pre Nursery & Prep

There will be no examination for these classes. A child will be graded on his/her performance and progress throughout the year.

Classes-I and II

The student will be continuously assessed throughout the whole year in scholastic as well as co-scholastic areas.

Class - III to VIII

There will be two periodic tests, one for each term. Students will appear in half-yearly examination in September and Final Examination in February.

The distribution and weightage will be as follows -

Examination Weightage

- Periodic Test - 05 marks (Average of Best two)
- Subject Enrichment - 05 marks
- Multiple Assessment - 05 marks
- Portfolio - 05 marks
- Annual Examination - 80 marks

Students must secure minimum 40% in each subject for his/her promotion to next class.

Classes - IX & X

There will be three periodic tests in the entire academic year (PT1, PT2 & PT3) with syllabus cumulatively covered. The average of best two will be taken. Class IX will appear for Annual Examination in February.

Examination Weightage

- Periodic Test - 05 marks (Average of Best two)
- Subject Enrichment - 05 marks
- Multiple Assessment - 05 marks
- Portfolio - 05 marks
- Annual Examination - 80 marks

Classes - XI

There will be Weekly test, Half Yearly and Annual Examination.

Class - XII

There will be Weekly Test, Mid Term (July), Half Yearly, Pre Board Examination (I & II)



AWARDS

To motivate and encourage students, the school honors scholars by awarding academic prizes, merit certificates, scholar badges and scholar gowns.

- A. Prizes and certificates will be awarded for academics to students class wise as follows

Classes I and II

1. Prizes for Outstanding Performance are given in following categories
(a) Art (b) Dance (c) Craft (d) Music (e) Sports
2. Encouragement Prizes (for remarkable progress)
3. All Rounder Prize.
4. Hundred Percent Attendance.

Classes III, IV and V

1. First Proficiency (for students who obtain the highest marks in the aggregate in all the sections of the class)
2. Second Proficiency

Special Prizes will be awarded to the student who obtains highest marks in the class and excels in each of the following subjects : in all the sections of the class.

English, Mathematics, Environmental studies, Second Language, Third Language, Computer, Art, Craft, Music and Dance.

3. Hundred percent attendance.

Classes VI - XI

1. First Proficiency
Second Proficiency

for students who obtain the highest marks and second highest in the aggregate in all the sections of the class in aggregate respectively.



2. Special Prizes will be awarded to the student who obtains highest marks in the class and excels in each of the following subjects :(in all the sections of the class).

English, Mathematics, General Science, Social Studies, Second Language, Third Language and Computer.

3. Hundred percent attendance.

Criteria for the award of a scholar badge:

Class - IV - V: 95% and above in Aggregate and 90% in individual subjects: English, Mathematics, Second language, Evs. And 3rd Language [Must Pass in Computers]

Class - VI - VIII: 90% and above in Aggregate and in Individual subjects: English, Mathematics, Second language, Social Science, General Science and 3rd Language [Must Pass in Computers]

Class - IX, X: 90% and above *in* Aggregate and in Individual subjects: English, Mathematics, Second language, Social Science and General Science [Must Pass in Computers]

Class XI: SCIENCE - 85% and above in Aggregate and in all subjects.

Humanities & Commerce - 80% and above in Aggregate and in all subjects.

A student who receives a Scholar badge (green badge) for five (5) consecutive years will be awarded a scholar tie (blue) in the 6th year. A student who receives scholar badge for six(6) consecutive years will be awarded a scholar gown (blue blazer) in the seventh year.



EVALUATION SYSTEM

Progress report cards are issued at the end of Half Yearly & Annual Examination (ERP Generated)

1st semester: April to September - 2nd semester: October to March

1. Pre Nursery, Nursery and Prep: Holistic Progress Cards are based on continuous assessment in the class room.
 2. Class 1-11 Report cards are based on monthly test and continuous assessment in the class room.
 3. Class III-XII Report Cards are based on the performance in periodic test/ weekly test, term examination and on going assessment of work in the class room.
